

Our Lady of Guadalupe Wednesday, December 12

When Mary appeared to Juan Diego as Our Lady of Guadalupe, she had encouraging words for him. "Am I not here, I who am your mother?" In the image on Juan Diego's tilma (tunic), Mary identifies herself with the Aztec people. She has their hair and features, their symbolic maternity dress. She incorporated their important symbols

of the sun, moon, and stars. Today's Mass includes two Gospel options. Both are familiar passages from the Gospel of Luke - the Annunciation and the Visitation. Both are equally rele-

vant to today's feast because Mary's yes to Christ isn't only to care for him but to come to us. Our Lady of Guadalupe is pregnant. The image bears witness to Mary's yes to conceive the Savior of the World. But even in her pregnancy, she goes to care for Elizabeth. Now Mother to all the world, Mary comes to the aid of her children, reminding them of her presence among them.

Low Gluten Hosts are available for persons who are unable to receive regular Hosts at communion. If you need to receive a low gluten Host you must see the Priest before Mass and let him know of your need. He will instruct you about the special procedure you must follow to insure that you will receive the Host without any gluten coming into contact with the Host you will receive. If you suffer from severe Celiac disease or are highly sensitive to wheat you are welcome to ask about the Host and the procedure prior to attending Mass. God's word is a message of hope, and it has long been proclaimed in difficult times of exile, imprisonment and political turmoil. For those of us weary of dark news, the message may be a momentary relief on this Sunday. But do we believe it? What will it take for this word

to settle deep in our hearts and even motivate us to take hopeful action on behalf of those for whom hope is meaningless? If not us, then who? We are reminded in our readings and hymns today that the Messiah is on the way. Our Opening Hymn, On Jordan's Bank and our Preparation Hymn, Ready the Way, echo the exhortations of John the Baptist that we must prepare. Our Communion Hymn, Christ, Be Our Light, reminds us that we are a people in darkness searching for the light that can only be found in Christ. In our Recessional, Soon and Very Soon, we celebrate that Christ will soon be at the door. May the Lord be near to us at all times and may we be ever aware of his closeness to us.
