



Everyday Stewardship

I am struck by how Jesus addresses the disciples in the 21st chapter of John. They have been fishing all night, and when the dawn comes, Jesus asks, "Children, have you caught anything to eat?" They hadn't caught a thing, so he tells them what to do to finally fill their nets. These children thought they knew best, but they couldn't get the job done until they listened to Jesus. Like a child who needs a parent, these early followers of Jesus were learning that real maturity of faith requires trusting in and listening to the Teacher.

The stewardship way of life demands of us a certain maturity of discipleship. Just as a child is not yet ready to be a parent, an immature disciple may not yet be ready to sacrifice regardless of the cost or understand the true value of his generosity. So every day, we are challenged and called to respond, sometimes even with little cost to ourselves. But each step, no matter how small, brings with it growth. We are growing not only in maturity, but in the ability to trust in God and how to listen for the call as well.

Eric's Music Notes

God has indeed rescued us (psalm refrain) from death, yet if we follow the Lamb who has been slain (second reading) we shall run smack into death (first reading). What God rescues us from is our fear of dying for Jesus' sake, and our shame when we have, like Peter, run from the costs of discipleship (gospel). Jesus comes to Peter with understanding and forgiveness, telling him that despite his fears and his failures, he will none-theless catch an abundant harvest for God's kingdom. And so for us. We are rescued from our lack of courage and fidelity by One who understands our weaknesses, forgives our failures, and knows our hidden strengths. (*Cry Out With Joy*, GIA Publications)

Easter Sunday may have been two weeks ago, but the Easter Season is just beginning. Because the resurrection of Christ is so important, the event calls for a celebration that continues for many weeks. We continue singing hymns that proclaim the resurrection. Christ, the Lord, is Risen Today; At the Lamb's High Feast; and Alleluia! Alleluia! Let the Holy Anthem Rise all proclaim the joy of the season. Our Communion Hymn, The Supper of the Lord, speaks of Christ is a Eucharistic theme. He is the Bread of God, The Living Spring, The Bread of Heaven, indeed, the Bread of Life. Through Him we find our life in the Living God. As we continue our Easter celebration, let us be inspired by the risen Christ and the Holy Spirit to be energetic and hopeful witnesses in the world.

Choir rehearsal continues this Thursday, May 9, at 6:30 PM, in Church. New members are welcome. Join us as we prepare for Pentecost, Trinity Sunday and Corpus Christi.
