

Saints for this week -

September 14 - St Paul the Apostle spoke of the power of Christ's Cross. According to tradition, the Empress Helena discovered the Lord's Cross in Jerusalem on September 14, 320. Five years later, a great church was built on Mount Calvary by Emperor Constantine to shelter the holy relic. Parts of the wood of the Cross were sent to the major cities of Christendom, where they were shown to the faithful on this special feast. We may want to repeat those words from time to time that we pray during Lent: "We worship You, O Christ, and we praise You, because by Your holy Cross You have redeemed the world."

September 15—The Feast, popular in the Middle Ages, follows the feast of Mary's birth on September 8. It recalls the special bond between Jesus and Mary and reminds us of the torment and suffering of Christ. Mary suffered greatly as the Mother of God, and the pain she felt was real. The feast of Our Lady of Sorrows recalls the succession of sorrows Mary experienced during her life: 10 the prophecy she heard from Simeon in the Temple, 2) the flight into Egypt, 3) the three day loss of Jesus on the pilgrimage to Jerusalem, 4) the meeting of her Son, Jesus, on the way to Calvary, 5) The hours she stood beneath the Cross, 6) the removal of Jesus from the Cross, and 7) the burial of Jesus in the tomb.

On this day, we may want to keep in our prayers our neighboring Parish - Seven Dolors, in Yukon.

WORSHIP TOGETHER

24th Sunday in Ordinary Time

(Exodus 32: 7 - 11,13 - 14; I Timothy 1: 12 - 17; Luke 15: 1 - 32)

There's an old story that I think is rather funny. The phone rings and a little boy answers in a whisper: "Hello?" The caller says: "Hi, is your Mommy there?" "Yes!" "Can I talk with her?" "No! She's busy." "What about your Daddy, can I talk to him?" "No, he's also busy." "Well, is there anyone else there?" "My little sister." "Is there another adult there?" "Uh, huh. The Police." "Can I talk to one of them?" "No, they're busy." "How about anyone else?" "Well, there's the firemen, but they're also busy." "Good heavens", says the caller. "Your whole family is busy, the police and fire departments are there and they're busy!" What's everyone doing?" The little boy giggles and whispers: "They're looking for me." Today's passage of Scripture is about searching and finding. And that's an old story that illustrates the frantic nature of people who have lost something and are in search of it.

For the last several weeks, our readings have been focusing on the aspect of "getting involved" in the way that we live our Faith. To some, this may have seemed a "downer." But really, as St James tells us in his letter – "Faith without works is not Faith." In another words, the depth of our Faith is best displayed in the way we live Christ-like lives in service for one another; caring for each other. This week the readings take a turn that shows us another side of God – more of the compassionate side of Him (And doesn't each of us have different personalities – depending on the situation at hand). We sometimes forget about the tremendous Love God has for each of us and which is revealed in so many ways.

The central theme of today's readings is the invitation to believe in a loving, patient, merciful, and forgiving God. Today's readings remind us that God actively seeks out the lost, wants their repentance and rejoices when the lost are found. God is always eager to be merciful toward us, not vengeful and punishing (as some of us may have been raised to believe). He is always in search of His lost and straying children, as Jesus explains using the three short parables.

God's mercy is not parsed out in dribs and drabs, or divvied up based on who is most worthy of it. Rather, god's mercy is lavishly poured out upon us because we need it – not because we deserve it. We must be careful to not fall into the trap of being the other son mentioned in today's Gospel. If we are to be faithful to God's plan for us in this life, we cannot walk around with hardened hearts. God's plan for us is to bring Saint Paul's message alive in our time and place. Do we live our lives in such a way that people will believe us when we tell them, "Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners"?

Let us Pray for the Conversion of the World & for Peace.

I believe that Jesus came to save me, then I must walk and talk as someone saved, not as someone still lost. Holding onto grudges, past hurts, bitterness or hostility have no place in the life of a Christian. Remember that when Jesus was asked by His disciples how to pray, He gave them the Lord's Prayer. He indicates that being forgiven is linked to how we forgive — Forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors. We need to remember this the next time we try winning a grudge match with someone. Walking in the ways of the Lord requires that we be ever-mindful that we have been saved by our faith in Jesus, and that there is no room in our lives for revenge. Rather, there is room only for love, mercy, and forgiveness.

As we go through today – and through the week and our life – we always need to evaluate ourselves. This can be seen as a self-reflection – or better yet – how do other people perceive us? If we have been in sin, God's mercy is seeking us, searching for our souls with a love that is wild and beyond all imagining. No sin is too big for God to forgive. He gave His Son to us to show us not only how much He cares for and loves us. But also – the extent to which He will go so that we do not get lost, but will be found so that we can live with Him forever in Heaven. Imagine that! Do you have any friends who would go that far for you?

Let us pray today and every day that we will allow God's love and forgiveness into our lives. Let us also ask God for the courage to extend this forgiveness to others who have offended us. As forgiven prodigals, we must be willing to forgive those who hurt us.



For a Catholic to be a sponsor for the Sacraments of Baptism or Confirmation, one must be a practicing Catholic regularly attending Sunday Mass and receiving the Sacraments, a registered member of the Parish and a faithful contributor to the support of the Parish for a minimum of four months. All requests for a certificate should be made four weeks in advance of the designated date needed for sponsorship.
