

WORSHIP TOGETHER

1st Sunday of Lent

Today, marking the first Sunday of Lent, we hear in Matthew of Jesus' forty days in the desert. Hearing of Jesus' time being tested by Satan prompts us, perhaps somewhat naturally, to ponder the ways we are tested in our lives. No one of us is without weakness.

A children's story entitled - Saint George and the Dragon, was the 1985 Caldecott Medal winner. It recounts the ancient tale of Saint George battling a dragon plaguing an English city. (Spoiler alert: he defeats the dragon.) While he is the prototypical knight on a white horse, what struck me as I read this book for the first time was the suffering the brave knight endures. He is cut, beaten and bruised in his battle with the dragon. His clothes are torn and his shield battered. No shining armor is to be seen – at least on the outside.

What *does* shine is the knight's bravery amidst his fear and knowledge of his weakness against the dragon. This and his virtue gleam far brighter than a sword could in the sunlight. It is the same with Jesus as He is tempted by Satan. I imagine Jesus tired and hungry on the outside, suffering while imagining having the authority and respect He knew that was his due. However, Jesus' faith in the Father shines forth and is what enables Him to defeat the dragon before Him.

Now in the midst of our forty days of Lent, let us place similar trust in God. Though knowing our weakness, let us also realize the strength and grace that God bestows so we, like Jesus and the brave Saint George, may overcome the dragon before us.

DLA

And now – something that I didn't like to do when I worked with Prudential Ins, and something I still do not like to do. But it is one of those necessities of life – asking for money.

This weekend our Diocese kicks off the DLA. We are all familiar with it from past years. Over the past few weeks, our Catholic Accent has had articles speaking on this appeal. You may have already received a letter from the Bishop and me.

The funds raised by this collection benefits a multitude of services: The Diocese of Greensburg consists of 78 parishes with nearly 130,000 Catholics.

In addition to supporting the Office for Priestly Vocations and the formation of men to become priests for the diocese, the Diocese of Greensburg provides priestly ministry through its International Priests Program, which currently has 23 priests from the Philippines, India and Nigeria.

The Diocese has 12 Catholic schools—10 elementary and two junior-senior high schools—with more than 2,200 students in pre-K to 12.

There are more than 7,200 young people in parish faith formation programs, which are supported by services from the diocese.

The Diocese helps people in need through Catholic Charities.

Catholic Charities has raised nearly \$1.4 million through the Communities of Salt and Light Award dinner. The funds go directly to material assistance for people in need.

The Diocese has distributed nearly \$500,000 in Poverty Relief Fund Grants to community groups that help people in need. The program is operated by Catholic Charities

Catholic Charities answers nearly 20,000 calls for assistance, deliverers \$147,500 in aid to families, helps families pay their utility bills, with heating fuel and provides emergency food boxes.

The Diocese of Greensburg has trained and cleared more than 15,000 employees and volunteers in order to protect children.

ONLY - 2.3 % of the moneys raised go to Diocesan administration. AND JUST UNDER 6% of the moneys raised go to materials & supplies for the appeal. The rest breaks down as follows:

Almost 8 % of the DLA moneys raised goes to Catholic Charities – and as mentioned earlier, 11.7 % is used for the Retired Priests, international priests, vocations and permanent diaconate programs; 20.9% for other Diocesan Ministries *e.g*; Evangelization and communications, Faith, Family & Discipleship, Tribunal & Worship Office, Hospital & Prison Ministry – to name a few; 21.% goes to our Catholic Schools; and almost ONE-THIRD of the DLA Moneys raised – or – 29.8 % was returned thru the Parish Share.

The Weekend of March 11 - 12 is Commitment Weekend – when we will all have the opportunity to make a commitment to this year's DLA.

I know that, because of the economy many people are strapped for funds. I do not expect anyone to take food off their dinner table for this. But I do hope that we prayerfully consider how the Lord blesses us each day, and how we can, as Faithful Stewards of all that God blesses us with, give a return to the Lord as a show of gratitude thru this Appeal.

We thank you for your generous support in past Diocesan Campaigns, as well as your generosity to our own Parish.

As many of you may know – in addition to living at the Parish, I, like you, am a property owner with Utilities, Insurances, and Taxes that come due. And so, like you, I know what it is to try balancing a budget every month.

Again, Thank You, God Bless You, and May God continue the good work He has begun in each of us.
