For a Catholic to be a sponsor for the Sacraments of Baptism or Confirmation, one must be a practicing Catholic regularly attending Sunday Mass and receiving the Sacraments, a registered member of the Parish receiving contribution envelopes to support the Parish for a minimum of four months.

Young adults of parishioners who have earlier been under their parent's registration and who are now on their own and remain in the Parish must register as an adult parishioner and receive envelopes. All requests for a certificate should be made four weeks in advance of the designated date needed for sponsorship.

(Acts 1: 12 - 14; 1 Peter 4: 13 - 16; John 17: 1 - 11)

Today's Gospel application in our lives is already contained in the final prayer of Jesus. There, He speaks of Himself as being glorified in His disciples. This is because, at last, they know that Jesus and His teaching indeed come from the Father in Heaven. In this, as well, Jesus' work is accomplished. Now He sends them into an unredeemed world with the message of truth and eternal life. There are those in this world who will reject and hate the message, so much so, that they are beyond the prayer even of the One Who is about to die for them. Peter reflects his own bitter experience when he speaks to us today of the rejection of the followers of Jesus Christ. Certainly, the words of Jesus and of Peter warn us against an over-optimistic view of human nature. There remains a worldly power that still believes in transitory glory. There is a Prince of this world who hates the One on the cross. But ours is also a world filled with people who can see through the façade that some people put on, and therefore are able to seek something better. The Spirit of God works in them and in us. The Feast of the Spirit / the Feast of Pentecost is only one week away. Let us join with Mary and the Apostles in prayer, that we be willing to receive God's Spirit in our lives; that we be willing to accept God's Spirit within our lives; that we be willing to be renewed as the courageous messengers of Christ – willing to cooperate with that Spirit to assist in the renewing of the Earth. Christ will be glorified in our time in the measure that we become so.

Saints for the week - (OOPs! Forgot to include these in last week's bulletin)

May 14 - St Matthias, (1st century) apostle. According to the Acts of the Apostles, St Matthias was chosen to replace Judas Iscariot as one of the twelve Apostles after the resurrection of Jesus. Two men, Barsabbas and Matthias, were proposed, but only one was selected. A companion of Jesus during His public ministry, Matthias was among the seventy-two disciples whom Jesus sent out to preach. He was also a witness to Christ's resurrection. Tradition says that he preached the Gospel in Judea, Cappadocia, and near the Caspian Sea. He suffered martyrdom by crucifixion.



May 15 the Church honors Saint Isidore, a Farmer. Isidore was born at Madrid, Spain, in the latter half of the 12th century. For the greater part of his life he was employed as a laborer on a farm outside the city. Many marvelous happenings accompanied his lifelong work in the fields and continued long after his death. He was favored with celestial visions and, it is said, the angels sometimes helped him in his work in the fields. St. Isidore was canonized in 1622. In 1947 he was proclaimed the patron of the National Rural Conference in the United States. He is the patron of farmers.

This day provides us with an opportunity to remember our link to the land and to all those who provide us with food through the guiding Hand of God. We are indebted to them for all the labor they commit themselves to, bringing us the necessary food to stay alive. Food is for our bodies what the Eucharist is for our souls!
