

For a Catholic to be a sponsor for the Sacraments of Baptism or Confirmation, one must be a practicing Catholic regularly attending Sunday Mass and receiving the Sacraments, a registered member of the Parish receiving contribution envelopes to support the Parish for a minimum of four months.

Young adults of parishioners who have earlier been under their parent's registration and who are now on their own and remain in the Parish must register as an adult parishioner and receive envelopes. All requests for a certificate should be made four weeks in advance of the designated date needed for sponsorship.

Saints for the Week -

July 25 - St James (? - 44) - He was the brother of St John and, like him, a fisherman. He was one of the witnesses of the Transfiguration and one of those who slept through most of the Agony in the Garden. He was the first of the apostles to be martyred, being beheaded by King Herod Agrippa I to please the Jewish opponents of Christianity. He was buried in Jerusalem, and nothing more is known about him until the 9th century. Tradition says that the relics of St James were brought to Spain some time after his martyrdom.

July 26—Ss Joachim and Ann, parents of Mary - Ancient Christian Tradition records the names of Sts Joachim and Anne as the parents of Mary, the mother of Jesus. They were both members of the tribe of Judah of the house of David. According to tradition, Joachin and Anne came to Jerusalem from Galilee. Over the centuries, they have been honored, especially in the East, at great churches and shrines built in memory of them. Historically and biblically, not much is know of Joachim and Anne, except that they are the parents of Mary and grandparents of Jesus.

### .16<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time -

(Wisdom 12: 13, 16 - 19; Romans 8: 26 - 27; Matthew 13: 24 - 43)


If any of us do any kind of gardening, I think we are familiar with the dilemma of weeds growing with the intended plants. We know that when the ground is dry, especially in this part of Western Pennsylvania, it takes effort to pull the weeds without disturbing our good plants. And we know that after a nice rain (like we had this past week) weeding is easier because the ground is soft, yet because it is soft the risk is still there of uprooting the intended plants along with the weeds. Today's Scripture readings tell us about a very patient and compassionate God Who is hopeful that the so-called "weeds" among us will be converted. The readings warn us that we should not be in a hurry to eliminate such elements from the Church or society or the family on the basis of unwarranted and hasty judgment.

The selection from the Old Testament book of Wisdom shows us a merciful and patient God, different from the disciplining and punishing God presented in the book of Genesis. In the short selection we have from Paul's letter to the Church in Rome we are reminded that the Spirit of God goes on empowering us in our prayers and in our weakness. So we should be patient with ourselves and others – sometimes easier said than done. And in Matthew's Gospel passage we hear three short parables: the parable of the wheat and the weeds, the parable of the mustard seed, and the parable of the yeast kneaded into the flour. The last two parables (of the mustard seed, and of the yeast) tell us that God's Kingdom will grow. It will grow to a size beyond anyone's wildest dreams. The parable of the wheat and the weeds requires a little more explanation.

Jesus presents a wise and patient God Who allows the good and the evil to coexist in the world and blesses the evil ones for the little good they may have done, so that the evil ones may come to conversion before their time ends. Jesus says: "Let the seed and the darnel grow together till the harvest time." In other words, God awaits repentant sinners, giving them the strength to acknowledge their weakness. He calmly recognizes that there is evil in the world, but He sees that evil as no excuse for the good people not to do good with the power of God at their disposal. Through the parable of the wheat and the weeds in today's Gospel, Jesus calls each of us to be patient with those who fail to meet the high ethical standard that is expected of a Christian.

For you and for me – we need to practice patience and show mercy. Let us patiently and lovingly treat the "weeds" in our society as our brothers and sisters and to do all in our power to put them back on the right road to heaven, especially by our good example and our fervent prayer for their conversion. Most of us have been a weed in God's field at some point in our lives – maybe more than once or twice. And hasn't He shown us mercy by extending His forgiveness when we asked it of Him? So should we show patience, understanding and mercy to others. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, God can change even the ugliest thorn into a blossom of faith. In God's field we have two responsibilities: to grow in grace, and to share His Word and love with others.

Let Us Pray for the Conversion of the World & for Peace!
