

For a Catholic to be a sponsor for the Sacraments of Baptism or Confirmation, one must be a practicing Catholic regularly attending Sunday Mass and receiving the Sacraments, a registered member of the Parish receiving contribution envelopes to support the Parish for a minimum of four months.

Young adults of parishioners who have earlier been under their parent's registration and who are now on their own and remain in the Parish must register as an adult parishioner and receive envelopes. All requests for a certificate should be made four weeks in advance of the designated date needed for sponsorship.

27th Sunday in Ordinary time:

Rejection: A Story and History of Acceptance Mt 21: 33-43

A priest who suffered an extremely strained relationship with his parishioners was finally appointed chaplain at the city prison.

In the farewell party, the people came in great numbers to hear him. The priest chose as his text: "I go and prepare a place for you; that where I am, there you may be also" (John 14:3). Poor priest, he must have been treated so badly despite his good works that he wished his parishioners to follow him — not as co-chaplains but as inmates!

REJECTION is commonplace. It is something we often encounter in our journey through life. In a family, we can often a member or two who are rejected by parents or siblings. Leaders too are often victims to rejection. In a multicultural society, people belonging to a minority group or class

In this Sunday's Gospel (Matthew 21:33-43), Jesus tells a parable about a vineyard owner who sends servants and eventually his own son to collect the harvest. However, they are rejected and mistreated, just like the priest in a farewell party who wished his parishioners to follow him as inmates. Rejection is a common experience in life, whether within families, among leaders, or in multicultural societies.

The history of Christianity is also marked by rejection. God sent prophets to be His servants, but they were killed. Then God sent His Son, Jesus, who was also rejected and crucified. *Rejection continues in the present day, seen in the diminishing Church attendance and the "pick-and-choose" mentality of some Catholics.*


To address this phenomenon of rejection, **we must first renew our appreciation of Christ**. Modernity, secularism, and materialism have led to a rejection of God, but having Christ with us gives us hope and resilience in difficult times. Second, **we should cherish the beauty of our faith**. Some Catholics distance themselves from the Church, but often it is because they have not actively practiced their faith or participated in its activities. Lack of engagement leads to a lack of appreciation and knowledge.

Lastly, we must fully accept Christian teachings without compromise. Sometimes we are tempted to reject teachings that appear uncomfortable or burdensome. However, the Church's teachings are rooted in morality and God's will for us. We are called to accept and follow them without compromise, even when they go against practicality or societal norms.

In summary, rejection is a part of life, but we can overcome it by renewing our appreciation of Christ, cherishing our faith, and accepting Christian teachings without compromise. By doing so, we can find strength, hope, and a deeper connection with God in the face of rejection.
