For a Catholic to be a sponsor for the Sacraments of Baptism or Confirmation, one must be a practicing Catholic regularly attending Sunday Mass and receiving the Sacraments, a registered member of the Parish receiving contribution envelopes to support the Parish for a minimum of four months.

Young adults of parishioners who have earlier been under their parent's registration and who are now on their own and remain in the Parish must register as an adult parishioner and receive envelopes. All requests for a certificate should be made four weeks in advance of the designated date needed for sponsorship.



32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time "Be prepared Be ready"

On November 26, another liturgical year will come to an end with the solemn celebration of the Feast of Christ the King. As the liturgical year ends, it is interesting to note how the flow of the Catholic liturgy focuses on the theme of the Second Coming. We need to be ready. This is the theme of the Catholic liturgy as we approach the celebration of the Feast of Christ the King.

Jesus was an amazing story teller who used the circumstances of his day to explain the truths of eternal life. The wedding customs of the Jewish people during the time of Jesus, which still exist today, are very different from anything that we are used to.

Unlike our own traditions, where weddings are organized with detailed precision, the Jewish wedding hinges on expectation rather than certainties. The maidens accompany the bride, and the groom presents himself at any given moment. He can show up during the day or even at night. No one knows when he will come.

Expectation, rather than certainty: this is precisely the message of the parable. This life will end and a new life will begin unannounced, at any given moment. Thus, we need to be ready.

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells the parable of the Wise and Foolish Virgins. The bridesmaids are waiting for the bridegroom, and some of them take extra oil while others do not. When the bridegroom is delayed, the wise bridesmaids who took extra oil are prepared, while the foolish ones run out and are locked out of the party. This parable teaches us the importance of being prepared for the unexpected. The bridesmaids represent all Christians, and the oil represents good works. Just as a lamp without oil is useless, faith without good works is dead.

We must strive to engage in good works and keep our faith alive. This means living lives filled with love, kindness, and service to others. It means being prepared for the Lord's coming, whenever it may be.

The message of this parable is relevant to us today. As we approach the end of the liturgical year, we are reminded to prepare for the end of our lives and the end of the world. Rather than living in fear or seeking to predict the exact timing of these events, we should focus on following the example of the wise virgins.

By engaging in good works and persevering in our faith, we can be ready for the Lord whenever He comes. Our faith is not just about belief, but also about action. Let us strive to live lives that reflect the love of Christ and the teachings of the Gospel.

May we always be prepared, keeping our lamps filled with the oil of good works. In doing so, we will be ready to enter into the eternal joy of the heavenly banquet when the Lord calls us home.
