For a Catholic to be a sponsor for the Sacraments of Baptism or Confirmation, one must be a practicing Catholic regularly attending Sunday Mass and receiving the Sacraments, a registered member of the Parish receiving contribution envelopes to support the Parish for a minimum of four months.

Young adults of parishioners who have earlier been under their parent's registration and who are now on their own and remain in the Parish must register as an adult parishioner and receive envelopes. All requests for a certificate should be made four weeks in advance of the designated date needed for sponsorship.



2ND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

WHAT ARE YOU LOOKING FOR?

The question "What are you looking for?" is often asked when we enter a store without knowing exactly what we need. We wander around hoping to find it somewhere on a shelf. In the Gospel, Jesus asks this question to John's disciples who decide to follow Him. He wants to know their intentions and what they are searching for.

Our search for meaning and fulfillment is a lifelong journey. We look for things that make us feel complete as individuals. Sometimes, we have mentors or guides like John who point us in the right direction, but eventually, we must continue the journey on our own. Jesus' response to the disciples' inquiry is an invitation to "come and see." It implies that following Him is uncertain and requires trust. This is similar to young Samuel's experience in the First Reading, where he hears God's call but needs guidance to understand it.

Being a disciple is not always straightforward. We may feel confused about what we should do and make mistakes even when we try to do what we believe is God's will. God's invitation can be uncertain and confusing, but this is part of the beauty of discipleship. It allows us to grow in our understanding of God and become more discerning of His plans for us. We should aim to mature in our faith, like John or Eli, who knew the purpose of the call. However, if we find ourselves confused and uncertain, we should not be discouraged. We must persevere in staying close to Jesus until we can confidently say, "We have found the Messiah," and then invite others to join us on this journey.

Let us remember that our search for fulfillment and purpose is a lifelong process. We may encounter uncertainty and confusion along the way, but by staying close to Jesus and seeking His guidance, we will discover the true meaning of our lives. Let us be open to His invitation and trust that He will lead us to what we are truly looking for.



Bishop Kulick to speak at events for men and women in the Diocese in January

Bishop Larry J. Kulick is inviting men and women in the Diocese of Greensburg to attend gatherings this month at Blessed Sacrament Cathedral, Greensburg. "Transformed," a gathering for men, will be held Monday, Jan. 22, and "Beloved," a gathering for women, will be held Monday, Jan. 29. Both begin at 6:30 p.m. and will feature the Bishop speaking on "Created in God's Image." The gatherings will include prayer, reflection, small group discussion, Eucharistic Adoration and opportunities for the Sacrament of Reconciliation with multiple confessors. There is no cost, and no reservations are required.
